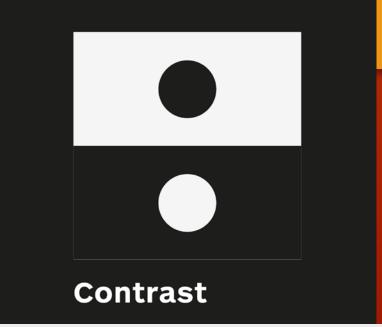

Contrast, Hierarchy, Balance, Scale & Proportion, Emphasis, Movement & Rhythm, Pattern, Unity

### Contrast/Readability

 Contrast can be defined as a difference between two or more elements in a composition. The more difference between the elements, the easier they are to compare and comprehend.

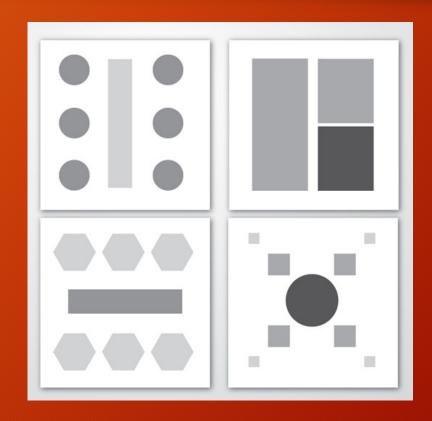

## Scale & Proportion

# Think about the design principles and your message!

Choose 3 things that you want your audience to see right away, your secondary information should be smaller (hierarchy)

Consider readability - can your audience see your content if they walk by it, can they ready it up close? (Contrast)

Is it attention grabbing? Is it visually appealing? (Balance, Scale, Proportion)

#### Tips

- Define your Goals
- Know your Target Audience
- Schedule posts in advance
- Find out what's Trending
- Use #hastags
- Be Consistent
- Use images with your posts to grab attention
- Plan your content

- Use programs like Hootsuite, Buffer, etc.
- Analyze your posts results
- Interact with your audience (ask questions, reply, call for action)
- Giveaways! Have your audience, like, share and comment to be entered into a prize. Everyone likes free stuff.
- Link Social Media together (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Youtube)
